

How to apply:

There will be several different types of award. Please indicate in your proposal which type of award you are applying for:

1. **Main commissions.** 2 awards of £8,000 to £10,000 (fee & materials) will be made over the two years for making new work to be shown in the public realm. You should be an established artist whose work has been shown extensively nationally (and ideally internationally). It is expected that there will be an element of residency in these commissions, the cost of which will be covered from the award, though some additional support may be available if needed.
2. **Intermediate commissions.** 4 awards over the two years of between £3,000 and £5,000 will be made for early or mid career artists. Ideally there will be an element of residency, and certainly on-site research, in these commissions for making new work to be shown in the public realm.
3. **Project bursaries.** 4 awards of between £1,500 and £2,500 will be made for artist-led or curator-led projects over the two years. These may be experimental and developmental, and need not necessarily produce an exhibition outcome. They are open to individuals, collaborations and organisations.

Your proposal:

You should send us a proposal - ideally electronically - consisting of the following:

- >> your C.V.
 - >> representative images of your work, or links to it on your website
 - >> a written proposal outlining what you propose to do. This can (and ideally should) include visual material
 - >> an estimate of the cost of your proposal. Please be realistic about this; if the cost is greater than the available funding then try to indicate where you think the shortfall could be raised from.
- >> Funding for documentation, marketing, publicity, publications and administrative costs lies elsewhere in the overall budget, so it is not necessary to include these costs in your proposal.
- >> You may choose to write a proposal for a specific site, or you may want to respond to a generic type of site (such as 'landscape'), or you may want to outline an approach or strategy that you would enact.

Closing date:

The closing date for submitting proposals is January 19 2009. Proposals received after this date will not be considered. There is likely to be a second submission deadline in January 2010, which you will be informed of if you have joined our mailing list. The selection panel will meet on January 22 2009.
